Kent Bramlett is Professor of Archaeology and the History of Antiquity at La Sierra University, having earned his PhD at the University of Toronto in Near Eastern archaeology. He is also Codirector of CNEA and the Balu'a project, Jordan.



Thomas (Tom) Davis, Professor of Archaeology at Lipscomb University, is also Assoc. Director of the Lanier Center for Archaeology. For years, he was Director of the Cyprus American Archaeological Research Institute and co-directs several projects.



Kendra Haloviak Valentine is Professor of New Testament Studies at La Sierra University, having earned her PhD in New Testament Ethics at the Graduate Theological Union at Berkeley. She has also taught on study tours to the Middle East.




