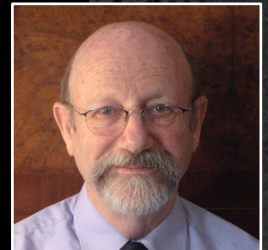
Dr. John J. Collins is Professor of Old Testament Criticism and Interpretation Emeritus at Yale University. He is THE world expert on apocalyptic literature related to the Hebrew Bible/Old Testament and the Dead Sea Scrolls. A widely respected scholar, he has served as president of the two most prestigious biblical studies societies in the US—SBL and CBA.

Dr. Alex P. Jassen is Ethel and Irvin Edelman Associate Professor of Hebrew and Judaic Studies at New York University. He has published widely on the Dead Sea Scrolls and ancient Judaism and served as the academic advisor of the Dead Sea Scrolls exhibit at the Science Museum of Minnesota. A current area of interest is violence in the Dead Sea Scrolls.



Dr. Jodi Magness is Kenan Distinguished Professor for Teaching Excellence in Early Judaism at the University of North Carolina at Chapel Hill. Magness' research focuses on the archaeology of Palestine in the Roman, Byzantine, and early Islamic periods. Among her numerous publications, *The Archaeology of Qumran and the Dead Sea Scrolls*.

Dr. Emanuel Tov is Professor of Bible at the Hebrew University in Jerusalem. He specializes in the textual criticism of Hebrew and Greek Scripture as well as in the Qumran Scrolls. A prolific author/editor, he has published widely in these academic areas, and for 13 years he was the editor-in-chief of the Dead Sea Scrolls Publication Project.



Dr. Sidnie White Crawford is Willa Cather Professor of Hebrew Bible and Second Temple Judaism emerita at the University of Nebraska-Lincoln. A world-renowned scholar, she has worked extensively on the Dead Sea Scrolls and Textual Criticism of the Hebrew Bible/Old Testament and chairs the Old Testament editorial board of *Hermeneia*.

Ms. Sabal Al-Zaben (PhD candidate, Andrews University) grew up in the shadow of Tall Jalul, Jordan, a tell her father, Akash Zaben, a Jordanian military commander, donated to the Department of Antiquities. She worked for several years in the Department, helping conserve sites like Umm ar-Rasas.
