Investigations are designed to be impartial. Both parties are given equal opportunity to participate, and decisions are based on facts, not assumptions.

3. Supportive Resources Available

You can access support services such as counseling, academic adjustments, and an advisor of your choice to help you through the process.

4. Clarification and Resolution

The process can help clear up misunderstandings or false assumptions, especially when communication or intentions may have been unclear.

5. Structured Timeline and Process

The investigation follows a clear process with defined steps and timelines, which can help reduce uncertainty.

6. Protection of Rights and Due Process

You are entitled to know the nature of the allegation, review evidence, and respond. You are not expected to navigate this alone.

7. Educational Outcome (if applicable)

If a policy was violated, outcomes are often designed with a developmental focus to help support learning, accountability, and future growth.
